- * "Since children who have reached the use of reason are considered, for the purposes of Christian initiation, to be adults (canon 852:1), their formation should follow the general pattern of the ordinary catechumenate as far as possible, with appropriate adaptations permitted by the ritual. They should receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil, together with the older catechumens." [Appendix III, n. 18]
- * Seven as the age of reason. [O]n completion of the seventh year [...] the minor is presumed to have the use of reason. [see Can. 97:1, 2]
